Be sure to let them know you'd like trains to stop at Westerly more frequently throughout the day, too

**Updates on Westerly Station:** We've been on a roll lately-

 Charlestown Town Council passed a resolution supporting the Westerly Station high-level platform upgrade, so almost all of the adjacent communities in RI

- and CT are on record supporting it!
- The Westerly Station upgrades have also been incorporated into the State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) and are being finalized in the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP).
- Amtrak has also completed some engineering work in the design of the platforms. All of this gives legitimacy to the project in terms of its readiness for funding (which we are pushing Amtrak and the federal government for)

## Meeting with Charlestown's Bikeway Committee

The Block Island Sound Bikeway
Committee (which, despite the name, is a
Charlestown commission) has been busy
putting in an application for federal funding
for rural communities that will help advance
bicycle and pedestrian safety at specific
points along Route 1.

The committee also unanimously endorsed high-level platforms at the Westerly Station, in part because it would allow for easier boarding and enable bike + train commuting

I was excited to see the new cafeteria, renovated classrooms and other student health & wellness spaces during the open house and ribbon-cutting ceremony of Dunns Corners Elementary School.

All of this was made possible thanks to the \$50 million bond that Westerly voters passed in 2022 and the School Construction Bond that Rhode Island passed in 2018 to provide incentives and matching funds for school construction/renovation across school districts in Rhode Island.

A number of RI State Senators and I attended the 2025 Festival of Meals, hosted by Meals on Wheels of Rhode Island. A few years back, as a Meals on Wheels volunteer, I delivered meals to seniors—many living with disabilities or limited mobility—and saw how a warm meal and friendly visit can brighten someone's entire day. Good nutrition isn't just about food; it helps prevent falls and health issues, allowing seniors to stay strong and independent in their homes for
